LEADERSHIP is a key factor in the development of a Boy Scout. One of the most valuable things that Scouting offers a boy is the opportunity to be a leader and to develop his leadership skills. The **National Youth Leadership Training** provides an exceptional opportunity for the boy to do just that.

NYLT is an intensive 6 - day training experience for Senior Patrol Leaders, Assistant Senior Patrol Leaders, Patrol Leaders, and other youth leaders; as well as **prospective** troop leaders. The course concentrates on a up-dated systematic learning approach to the skills of leadership, with emphasis on both theory and practical application. For the boy who desires to be a better and more effective leader NYLT is an unparalleled opportunity.

EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES:

Your regular Boy Scout uniform is the official uniform for **NYLT**. Participants need to bring their normal camping gear for a week of camp, and will receive an equipment list upon registration. Patrol and troop gear, food and tentage, are provided. The Council will provide patch, certificate, (2) T-shirts and notebook.

HEALTH & SAFETY:

NYLT is operated in accordance with the National Health Standards of the Boy Scouts of America. All participants are covered by medical insurance as a part of their fee, and a fully equipped health lodge, with trained personnel, is located in camp. A doctor is on call, and the facilities of the local hospital are available if needed. All participants must be approved by their doctor prior to **NYLT**, using the Class 2 or 3 B.S.A. form provided. A participant will not be allowed to begin the course without a signed medical form and medication form.

ELIGIBILITY:

To participate in NYLT, a Scout must be at least 13 years of age and have earned the First Class rank. He must be a registered member of a Boy Scout troop, have the approval of his Scoutmaster, and should be either a current or prospective troop leader. Completion of the Troop Junior Leader Training course conducted by his Scoutmaster (**Scoutmaster Handbook**, Pages 50-67) is a necessary prerequisite to **NYLT**. Because this is an intensive training experience, participants should possess sufficient **maturity, judgment, and leadership potential to successfully complete this program.** Each participant will be evaluated throughout the course on their **skill, knowledge and attitude.**

REGISTRATION:

Registrations are made by completing the attached application form, including the Scoutmaster's approval, and mailing it, with the reservation fee of \$70.00, to the Council Service Center. Because of the benefits of this training to the troop, **it is highly recommended that the troop consider paying all or a portion of the participant's fee.** Reservations are accepted on a first come, first served basis and are **limited to 56 participants per session.** In order to insure acceptance, early reservations are recommended. Once a course is filled, a waiting list will be started, and applicants will be moved into the course as spaces become available due to **cancellation or non-payment of final fees by persons already assigned to the course.**

REFUNDS:

Fees will be refunded to applicants who cancel reservations **by written notice at least 30 days prior** to the course opening. The \$70.00 deposit will be forfeited if the cancellation is received less than 30 days before the course. **No refunds will be made for cancellations on or after the opening date of the course.** Final payment of the full \$200.00 fee is due by the course orientation date.

ORIENTATION:

The course orientation is mandatory for all youth participants and at least one parent.
